The Secret of Shelter Island

I've been reading a book lately. Yes, I do occasionally read a real book. Most of what I read are investment newsletters and I don't do much in the way of social networking on the computer. I've logged on to facebook a few times but I keep seeing names and photographs that I don't recognize so I'm not sure what's going on there. At that point I'll usually go read another article from a newsletter.

The book is called "The Secret of Shelter Island" by Alexander Green. Mr. Green has been an investment newsletter writer in recent years but has been very interested in the study of history, philosophy, psychology, science and religion for decades. The book was written in response to the stock market collapse of 2008. "A recession can shake up the status quo and force us to examine our goals and priorities." The book is meant to aid in the process. It's partly about money but also about putting money into perspective.

"The pages lean heavily on quotes and sources from antiquity. Why? When it comes to wisdom about how to live your life the best ideas are not new. As Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "All my best thoughts were stolen by the ancients."

"The Secret of Shelter Island is about recognizing the importance of money, but also the primacy of honoring and fighting for your highest potential, living the life you want, doing the work you enjoy, paying attention to your highest goals and values."

"Material wealth alone doesn't bring lasting satisfaction. And neither will nonmaterial blessings if you're wondering where you're going to get this month's rent. But combine a sensible approach to money with good choices about nonfinancial matters and the result is the best of both worlds."

The book has 68 chapters. Most of which are only three or four pages so you can easily read one or two chapters in just a few minutes. I just read the chapter called "The Secret of Shelter Island". What is the secret? It's a zinger. I'll tell you what it is in another newsletter. I'll finish this article with a story from the book.

"In 400 B.C.E. the Greek philosopher Diogenes taught that no man needed much – and that we shouldn't complain of material loss. He once went to Athens with his slave Manes, who ran away. Diogenes shrugged off his ill fortune saying, 'If Manes can live without Diogenes, why not Diogenes without Manes?'

So that's the philosopher Diogenes. "In *It's All in Your Head*, Stephen M. Pollan and Mark Levine relate a story about the famous ascetic:"

Diogenes is sitting on the side of the road eating his simple meal of porridge. A court philosopher sees him and comes over to chat. "You know, Diogenes, if you learned how to play up to the king like the rest of us, you wouldn't have to live on porridge." Diogenes doesn't even glance up from his bowl; he just says, "If you learned to live on porridge, you wouldn't have to play up to the king.
