### Highlights from our 1/24/08 Dinner Meeting

#### Realities of War Lessons of Dynamic Leadership by Major Shane Liptak

During September, 2005, Major Shane Liptak and the 3rd BCT deployed with 101st ABN DIV, to Kuwait. With 120-135 degree heat, his section's mission was to provide 24/7 communication services for a 3500+ Soldier Brigade Combat Team simultaneously across 6 geographically diverse locations.

The personnel in his team included Six soldiers (1 officer, 1 warrant officer, 4x NCO), all with minimal training, The constantly changing scenarios, shortage of critical personnel, lack of training, laptop, hard drive and server equipment failures, inter-operability problems, power, and environment variables, were just a few of the mission pitfalls and distracters. But no matter how complex or difficult the situation or environment, Liptak always managed to keep the mission focus and accomplish the primary objective(s).

Applying the management or control cycle process of Plan, Do, Check and Assess (PDCA) was a key component to the success of their mission. Breaking down the complexities of the mission into manageable pieces, focusing on planning the mission ensured that all scenarios and contingencies were recognized during the planning process. During the implementation of the mission, the constant assessment and reality checks provided the data to quickly and efficiently adjust the plan according to the situation, and enabled the team to anticipate impending scenarios and to take corrective action for the remainder of the mission.

In closing, Major Liptak summarized his lessons learned into three main thoughts. First, it's what we accomplish now that makes a difference. Winning is everything – no one plans to fail – one always plans to succeed and accomplish the mission. Second, always keep in mind that people can be your greatest asset or liability. (Which one are you?) And finally, life is full of variables – and the only constant is how you choose to react to the given scenario and challenges.

#### Lessons Learned In Dynamic Leadership LESSON 1: Keep the mission focus - and accomplish the primary Objective. LESSON 2: Sometimes things are not as complex as they appear. (They could be worse!) LESSON 3: Seek help when needed – Just be sure it's the right kind of help. **LESSON 4:** Sometimes the problem is right in front of your face. LESSON 5: Simple solutions are sometimes the best. LESSON 6: Its not always about winning – Actually it is! (No one plans for failure.) LESSON 7: Don't loose sight of what is important.
