





AACE Returns to Calendar Billing for Membership Dues

AACE International will be returning to a calendar year billing in 2011. Effective January 1, 2011, new members joining the association will pay pro-rata dues and be on a January 1-December 31 billing cycle from that point forward. New members joining in the first quarter (January 1-March 31) will pay \$143*. New members joining in the second quarter (April 1 - June 30) will pay \$117.25* while members joining in the third quarter (July 1 - September 30) will pay \$81.50* plus the fee. Individuals joining AACE as new members after October will pay the following year's dues* and receive benefits for the balance of the calendar year for free. (*All new members will pay a \$10 application processing fee.)

AACE will also be converting renewing members to the January 1-December 31 cycle. Individual members renewing in 2011 will be billed a pro-rata amount of dues based upon the month of their renewal, rounded down to the nearest dollar. "Our plan is to have all AACE International members renewing on the January 1-December 31 cycle by January 1, 2011. This uniformity of renewal date will allow us to also promote the Corporate Sponsorship Program more effectively as we will also be converting those renewals to the January 1-December 31 cycle in 2011," commented AACE President Steve Revay.
